Homeland Security:

GEMA has asked for a workshop for Emergency Managers within the state. Focus will be addresses within the state and the lack of address coverage for 30% of the state.

Natural and Cultural Resources:

Working with GBA to capture the location of all state facilities and associated leases, etc.

Transportation:

Demonstration of TREX provided to GISCC.

Recommendation to provide TREX presentation to GEMA.

Eric McRae is the new director of ITOS.

Discussions are continuing on how to improve the performance and data availability of the Clearinghouse.

No funding exists at the state level for GIS and the Clearinghouse.

Trying to make a central portal for GIS information at the national level.

Library of Congress is interested in preserving digital maps.
